30 June 2025, Correctional Institution for Women, Mandaluyong City

The first batch of 28 female Persons Deprived of Liberty (PDLs) from the Correctional Institution for Women (CIW) gained new livelihood skills through a five-day basic handloom weaving training conducted by the Department of Science and Technology-Philippine Textile Research Institute (DOST-PTRI).

The training concluded with the ceremonial turnover of five innovative handloom weaving machines, in partnership with DOST-National Capital Region and the Bureau of Corrections (BuCor), as part of the CREATTEEVs Program.

The CREATTEEVs (Creativity and Equity Through Accelerated Textile Technology Engagement and Entrepreneurship for Vulnerable Sectors) integrates science-based textile solutions with inclusive livelihood efforts, reaching vulnerable sectors like PDLs.
